Many sentences have a clear answer ("Can you shop with a fish?") but others will spark a conversation ("Is it bad to zap a bug?"). This means that the worksheets may not necessarily serve as a comprehension quiz, but they are a fun and interactive way to practice reading with newly learned phonics rules. **Your conversations will ensure that your students are reading for meaning and monitoring their comprehension.**

The worksheets are no-prep and can be used as part of whole group instruction, small group intervention, or independent centers work for phonics or reading fluency.

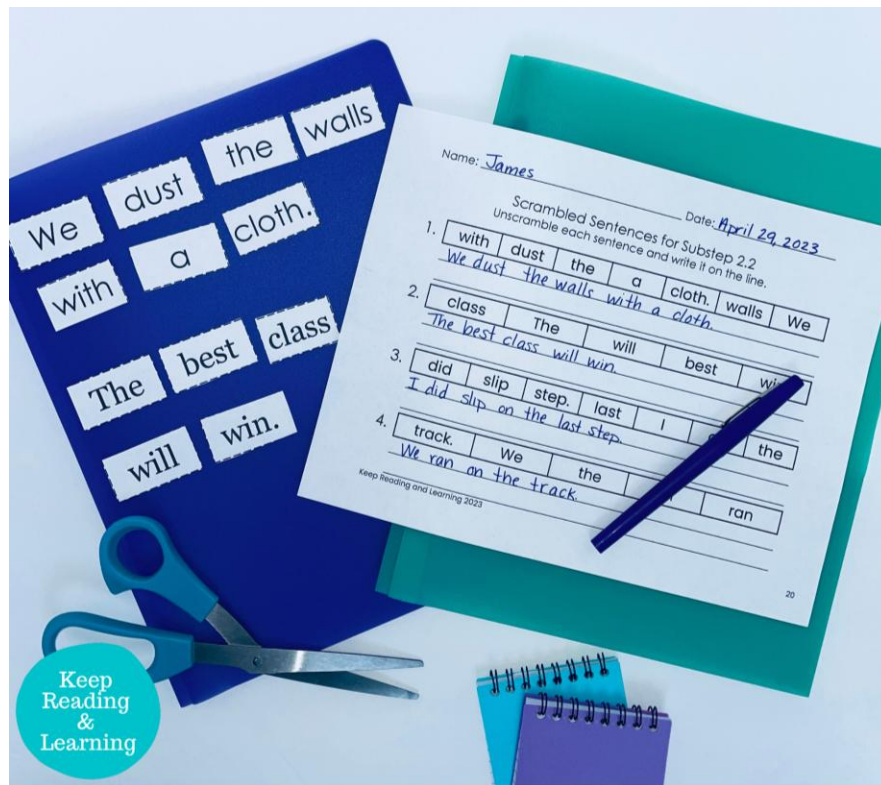
